Scavenger Hunt

Activity Sheet




A scavenger hunt is a fun way to learn about your school. You get to meet new people and discover where to go for help.

Working together as a team builds belonging and connection. It also helps your school feel like a community where everyone is welcome.

Instructions

1. Create a group of students to make and lead the school scavenger hunt.
2. Use the scavenger hunt guide to plan your adventure.
3. With the help of an adult, choose key places or people to include at each station.
4. Create clues that help participants find these locations. Try writing them as riddles or fun challenges that get people thinking and moving.
5. Decide how teams will track their progress. This could mean collecting stamps, stickers, or tokens at each stop.
6. Launch your scavenger hunt. Invite classes, groups or pairs of students to join in. Have each team visit all the stations.
7. After the hunt, reflect with your team. Which places were new to you? Who did you meet? How can knowing these people and places help when someone needs support?

Scavenger Hunt guide

Choose your locations

Pick five or more key places in your school or yard to highlight. Think about spaces that every student should know, especially new or younger students.

Plan your style

1. Chart style:

Design a chart featuring clues about each of the stations you want people to find. Each stop could have a unique identifier, like a coloured sticker, stamp, or marker. Participants collect these to prove where they've been.

2. Connection headquarters:

Set up a central station where teams collect clues one by one. Each location can have an identifier and a message like, *"You found me! Stamp your hand. Go back to the Connection Headquarters for a prize and the next clue."*

3. Your choice:

Design a scavenger hunt your way. Make clues that get participants thinking, moving, and learning about people and places that support student well-being. You can use the form on the next page or make your own!

Example clues

- "This place is where you could go if you forgot your lunch."
- "This is the place where you can practice your layups."
- "This is where you could go if someone were bothering you at recess."
- "This is where you can find posters for events at school."
